
April Update

I saw the little African penguins and ate some great seafood. In Jeffrey's Bay, we went horseback riding on the beach with some big sand dunes, which was fun until my horse decided it had been too long since he had seen the sea and took off galloping straight into the water and nearly pitched me into the sea. My legs were soaked and just about numb since the water was ice cold. Makes for a good story I guess. Ha. about three hundred meters high and about 27 kilometers long. When we got there, there was a long line of people waiting to do the gorge swing. It is similar to bungy jumping, but you are harnessed at the waist and you swing out at the bottom and then get pulled back up. I opted for walking around and taking in the scenic views.

In one of the hostels, we spent the night in a tree house surrounded by so many trees we felt like we were in the jungle. There were monkeys running on the roof as well. The last day we were in Durban and spent the day shopping in the world's largest shopping mall in the Southern Hemisphere. We have not been to a mall in a long time and when we walked into this huge mall we were a little overwhelmed. Overall, we had an amazing time eating lots of good food, getting some needed rest, and having some great adventures that we will never forget.
