There were several fun activities for the boys in the afternoons. They painted pillows, constructed a wooden game, did craft activities and had a treasure hunt. They played lots of sports in the afternoons and one day we all played crazy soccer. Picture this; one hundred boys and staff running





all over the field with four soccer balls trying to make a goal. It was like one minute you were chasing a ball and another minute one ball hit you in the back. It was definitely crazy, but we all had fun.

The evenings were filled with a movie night, a talent show, and lots of music and dancing. The Irish team taught the boys some Irish dancing. We locked elbows and swung round and round until we were dizzy. We all had fun.

In the mornings, after the teaching, the boys broke up in their small groups for Bible activity time. No one was designated to teach the little boys group, so I got to teach them along with two other leaders. Those little boys are just too cute. We had fun coloring pictures, learning the memory verses, doing puzzles and playing with legos. I really got to know two boys from the outside centers that were in my group. We had fun doing activities together all week. I hope I will get a chance to go to their center and visit them soon.



The last night was a special night. We all gathered together for a time of sharing testimonies. It was touching to hear of the trials that these boys had endured in the past and then of the triumphs God had given them through salvation and their time spent in the ministry. Many were presently facing trials and were looking to God for guidance. Then the leaders gathered around the boys and prayed that God would strengthen and guide them through their present trials and the ones to come. The rest of the night was celebrating with roasted meat, bread, and lots of dancing.

Miango Boys: These five boys I call my Miango boys. They have been reconciled back



to their homes in Miango. All of them were brought to the center because they were involved in occultic practices. I was close to all of these boys when they lived at the center. Two of them were happy to go back to their homes and the others have had some hard transitions. All of them came to camp this year and it was so good to see them and spend time talking to them. Some of the boys expressed that they are having difficulties being fully accepted by their families. One of them said that his

family does not believe that he is really a Christian and that he is just putting on a show. Pray for these boys and their families during this transition time.

August Blooms: August is the month that we get heavy showers almost every day. Due



to the heavy rain, the plants grow abundantly and the flowers bloom beautifully. I spend a lot of time in August planting and grooming my flower garden. It is always a pleasure to see the beautiful blooms. I spend time walking around the garden or sit reading a book surrounded by the sights and smells. This is definitely the time to enjoy the flowers because soon dry season will come and most of the flowers will fade away.
