Why I really brought them to my house was because I wanted to share the gospel with them. I had a conversation with the boys at Transition house that involved Heaven. I asked Shadrack if he knew what Heaven was and he said he did not know. I had a wonderful time teaching them about Heaven, sin, and God's forgiveness. Many of

the concepts were new to them so it will take some continued teaching for them to really understand what it means to ask Christ into your life. Both of them love to pray and it is great to listen to them pray and see them developing a better understanding of God.

Attack of the Mango: One Saturday, I was picking mangoes and avocados off the trees in

our compound with the guard. He was up in the tree picking them and then he would throw them down to me to put in a bag. It was not until the next day that I noticed a rash developing on my arms. I went to see the doctor and she said that I was allergic to mango sap. I had never heard of any reaction to mango sap since I had been here, but I did get sap on me picking the mangoes. I started taking antihistamine and using lots of hydrocortisone cream for the itching. After several days, the rash had not gotten better and it was spreading up my arms and to my neck and a

small bit on my face. I was definitely being attacked by one severe rash. I was afraid I would wake up with my eyes all swollen. I went back to the doctor and said I needed some stronger medicine. I started on a course of steroids and lathered my skin with anti-itch cream three times a day. It has taken several weeks for the rash to finally go away. There will be no more picking mangoes for me. I am definitely avoiding the mango tree!
