Open House: “As I went from street to street, I saw children with great potential wasted, without love, going from garbage to garbage looking for food to eat and bathing only once a month. No one to direct their lives, or tell them what they need to do. No one to give them a hug and tell them they love them. These children could be great leaders, inventors, pastors and make a positive change in the country, but they are wondering on the street corners because no one cares.” said Alex Moses, Assistant Supervisor of King’s Kids. On November 17, 2007 we had an Open House at one of the King’s Kids Centers. The King’s Kids ministry seeks to



holistically meet the physical, intellectual and emotional needs of needy children. King’s Kids provides the children food, clothing, shelter, literacy, medicine, vocational training, education and love in order to meet their deeper spiritual needs and help equip them to live a life for Christ. The Open House was meant to be an awareness for the community, churches and organizations in the surrounding area. We hoped to encourage people to be involved in the ministry by volunteering their time or financial support to make a difference in the children’s lives. The boys sang several songs during the program. We now have a new girl’s center in the village just outside of the city. We have ten girls at the center. The girls looked so cute. They came all dressed up and performed during the program.



Evangel Hospital: We have been really busy at the hospital this month. We had a lot of patients and many of them had severe injuries. We had a group of missionaries traveling to Cameroon for an outreach and they had a car accident on the way. Their van caught on fire and five of them came to the hospital with burns. We praise the Lord that four of them have been discharged from the hospital and only one remains for further treatment. We have had several patients who sustained multiple fractures from car accidents and we continue to pray for their healing. I have a ten-year old boy with Sickle Cell disease who had a stroke. It is so sad to see that happen to a child so young. Continue to pray for strength for the Physiotherapy department as we provide treatment for all of these patients. May the light of Christ shine through us.

Happy Thanksgiving: We had a wonderful gathering of missionaries for Thanksgiving. We had an abundance of food and some great fellowship. We did not have turkey, but we had some good roasted chicken and dressing with all different kinds of vegetables and salad. We even had pumpkin pie and pecan pie.
